

Overview:

The Faculty of Arts & Sciences, established in 1990, was the first faculty at the University. Initially, it offered both humanistic and scientific programs. In the academic year 2001/2002, the Computer Science program was transferred to the newly established Faculty of Information Technology. Subsequently, in 2000, the faculty was renamed the Faculty of Arts after introducing the Interior Design and Graphic Design programs and launching a Master's Program in Clinical Psychology.

In 2010, the Interior Design and Graphic Design programs were moved to the Faculty of Architecture & Design, leading to the renaming of the faculty back to the Faculty of Arts as of the academic year 2010/2011. The Department of Fundamental Sciences, consisting of Math and Physics, was added in the academic year 2014/2015, and the faculty reclaimed its original name, the Faculty of Arts & Sciences.

In 2019/2020, the MA program in English Language & Literature was reopened. During the academic year 2023/2024, the Department of Foreign Languages was established, introducing two new bachelor's degree programs in Chinese-English and German-English.

Admission Requirements for a Bachelor's Degree Program:

To be eligible for admission, students must meet the following criteria:

1.General Secondary Certificate: Students must have obtained the General Secondary Certificate or its equivalent.

2.Minimum General Average: A minimum general average of 60% is required.

3.Community College Diploma: Students who have passed the comprehensive diploma exam at community colleges in specializations equivalent to those offered by the Faculty are eligible for admission, provided their average is not less than 60%.

4.Course Equivalency: For students with a community college diploma, course equivalency will be determined in

accordance with the prevailing instructions at the time of admission.

These requirements ensure that students possess the necessary academic foundation and are well-prepared for their chosen field of study.

Admission Requirements for a Master's Degree Program

To be admitted to postgraduate studies, a student must meet the following criteria:

1. **Bachelor's Degree:** The student must have obtained a Bachelor's degree or its equivalent from a recognized university in the field of specialization or a related field.
2. **Academic Performance:** The student must have a general rating of no less than 'good,' which implies:

- A cumulative average of 68% or above.
- Alternatively, a general rating of 'very good' or higher in the higher diploma.

3. **Regular Study:** The Bachelor's degree must have been obtained through regular study.

Faculty Members:

The Faculty of Arts & Sciences at AAU has recruited elite faculty members renowned for their extensive experience and professional competence in their respective fields. These faculty members are dedicated to utilizing their expertise by incorporating teaching support aids in both the lecture halls and laboratories, which are equipped with state-of-the-art equipment, systems, and technologies.

Language of Instruction:

Teaching is conducted in English across all faculty specializations, except for Clinical Psychology, where both Arabic and English are used simultaneously.

Services & Laboratories:

The Faculty has language and translation laboratories equipped with state-of-the-art technologies, as well as special laboratories for the Clinical Psychology Department.

The Language Center:

The Centre offers four English Language Courses: English Communication Skills, Remedial English, English Proficiency 1, and English Proficiency 2, aimed at enhancing the language skills of students. The Center conducts a placement exam for all university students to determine their English language proficiency levels and utilizes e-learning methods in teaching their subjects.

Al-Ahliyya Amman Center for Counseling and Psychological Care

The Center was established at the university as a pioneering initiative to provide psychological and professional care, including assessment, diagnosis, and treatment, as well as individual and group level training for university students and the

local community. Additionally, the center offers preventive consultations to both the university's students and the local community.
